You might have some questions or be wondering what school will be like.




What is school like now?

School is a very safe place for us to be but we have had to make some changes to the way we do things. The main changes are:

Bubbles







Classrooms



Playtimes and outdoor learning



Bubbles



Some of you might know about our school "bubbles".

This is just another word for groups or classes.

At Boughton, each class is a bubble. The children in each class will stay together for all our daily activities. Classes aren't able to mix with each other at the moment.

Adults can move between the bubbles but have to maintain a distance from the children and each other.

Hygiene



Hygiene means keeping clean.

Do you remember back in March, we spent lots time washing our hands very carefully? We need to keep doing this.

If you need to cough or sneeze, use a tissue or cough into your elbow, then wash your hands. Remember: catch it, bin it, kill it.

Hygiene







Cover your coughs e-bug.eu and sneezes.





If you have no tissue, use your sleeve



Wash your hands for 20 seconds with soap and water.

To help keep time - sing 'Happy Birthday' twice.

Wash your hands when you arrive at school



As soon as you enter your classroom, you will need to wash your hands straight away.

This is to make sure we all have clean hands before we touch anything at school.

All the grown ups have to do this too, as soon as they arrive.

We are trying to make sure that we don't spread any germs from home or other places we have been.

Entrances and exits

Every class has its own entrance to school.

Mr Callow has painted some lines to help us recognise where to go.



Year 6 and Year 5 enter through the main gate.



Year 4 and Year 3 enter through the middle gate (in the middle of the hedge, at the front of school).



Year 2 enter through the playground gate. There is a one-way system marked out.

Entrances and Exits

Reception and Year I will walk down the lane at the side of school.

Reception will line up by the sence near the gate to the Reception outdoor area.

Year I will line up on the path near the door.

They will all need to stay close to their parents or carers while they wait. This is because the lane is used by cars visiting the fields behind

school.



Start and finish times

Class 6 and Class 4 will arrive from 8.30a.m.

Class 5, Class 3, Class 2 and Class I will arrive from 8.45a.m.

Class R will arrive at 9a.m.

The reason we have different start times is because we can't have all the children and parents arriving at once.

We have to try and help everyone manage social

distancing.

If possible, only one parent or carer should drop you off at school. This is to make sure there aren't lots of people on the school site all at one time.



What do the classrooms look like now?













Class 3

The main change is that we don't have any group tables now. You will sit at a table with one other person and this will be the place where you will do all of your learning and activities.

You can see that all the tables are facing the front of the class, where the teacher will be. In most classrooms children won't sit on the carpet. Reception and Year I will need to use the carpet sometimes.

What's good about the new arrangements?



Everyone knows where to sit.

They can all see the teacher and the board.


These tables have labels on them with the names of who will be sitting with them.

The very best bit...everyone gets a zip wallet or tub with all of their own resources in. Pencils, scissors, glue sticks and more!

Everyone is responsible for looking after their own resources. You have to make sure that you put everything away when you have finished with it.

Playtimes

Layout of the field:





Each bubble has its own zone on the field to play in. Two bubbles will use each zone but not at the same time. Key stage I and key stage 2 will have different playtimes.

We will go out to play whatever the weather, so you will need a spare pair of outdoor shoes in case it's very wet out there!

We will also do some of our learning outside, when possible.

Lunchlimes

Layout of the field:



Astroturf

Everyone will have packed lunch and will eat in their classroom. Lunch will be from 12p.m. to 1p.m. Each bubble will have 30 minutes to eat and 30 minutes to play.

We will use the same zones on the field to play at lunchtime, so while one bubble eats the other will play and then they swap.

Eating will be supervised by teachers and playing by lunchtime supervisors. Each zone has one lunchtime supervisor looking after it.

Some things have stayed the same.

We still have our Boughton Superheroes and our Good to be Green system, to help everyone behave well and try their best.





We still have our Boughton Values.

When we return to school, our value will be "Responsibility".


Children who stay on green all week will earn Every class (YI to Y6) has the special sticker at the chart displayed clearly end of the week on the wall. Stay on Start or the green traffic light, to be green all week. Everyone starts each lesson on the Start

We still have caring staff who will make sure you feel safe and looked after every day.

Good to be Green

Everyone can earn their Good to be Green sticker each week,

in the same way as before.



Hopefully nobody will have a yellow or red card, but if they do, they will need to miss a breaktime (or possibly more than one, depending on the offence) and will have to take a reflection sheet home to complete with their parents.

What do I need to bring each day?

We are trying to make sure we limit what comes in and out of school each day. This is so we can try not to spread germs between school and home.

The next slide shows you things that will STAY in school, things that come in EVERY day and things that you will need ONCE a week.

Please DO NOT bring pencil cases, extra books from home, toys, anything else not needed for your school day.

PE

Instead of getting changed into PE kits at school, you will need to wear your kit to school on your PE day. This is because we haven't the space to enable social distancing whilst you get changed; it also means your kit can be washed straight away, ready for the following week. Children from Y2 upwards will have one full afternoon of PE each week.

Parents in Year I and Reception will be advised separately of their arrangements.
